

It has been a very busy and successful Fall for Winthrop Public Schools as we had several school activities building up to the Thanksgiving Day break. In this newsletter you will find snapshots of activities that have occurred within the first 3 months of the school year depicting a multitude of accomplishments reflecting the academic, community and extra-curricular successes of our students and staff. Some key highlights include, another NEC Cheerleading title-" Grand Campions" with Nationals qualification, the Golf Team, Girls Soccer and Cross Country teams qualifying for States, individual student NEC All Star and All Conference recognitions, Student Council community food, clothing and toy drives, WMS student participation in the Jet Blue/Boston Celtics Rookie Flight Crew program, schoolwide participation in the 11 Foundation sponsored town-wide clean-up day and the WHS Drama Society's amazing production of the high school edition of Chicago. This year we have 39 students who have received the John and Abigail Adams Scholarship based on their performance on the MCAS. In order be eligible for the scholarship, students must the Advanced performance level on one of the three high school state assessment tests in ELA, Mathematics, or STE (Biology, Chemistry, Introductory Physics, or Technology/Engineering); and score at the *Proficient* level or higher on the remaining two high school state assessment tests; and have combined scores from the three tests that place them in the top 25 percent of students in the graduating class in their district. We are very proud of our students for this high-level achievement! Congratulations to Mr. Beck for the well-deserved selection by the Chamber of Commerce of the "Excellence in Education" award and to our students, Ryan Parker and Patrick Haskell, in receiving the Chamber of Commerce "Youth Award". Winthrop Public Schools is participating in the MDPH Seal Program, a school-based dental program that offers dental screenings, sealants, cleanings, fluoride varnish and referrals to a dentist in the community. Every child is eligible. Even if your child has a dentist, this program provides an extra visit and some good dental education. The student is seen in school and receives a toothbrush, floss and toothpaste at the end of the visit. A report of the visits and any needed follow-up is sent home with the student. We strongly encourage parents and guardians to sign up for this great in-school service. Please check your child's backpack for more information.


