- maintain a visual journal or sketchbook

Sketchbook

You are required to maintain a sketchbook to plan and sketch ideas for projects, make observational drawings, and at times take notes or write reflections. Please provide a folder or sketchbook to be kept in class.

VTS

What is VTS? Visual Thinking Strategies is a way of closely looking at a work of art. Three questions will help guide us in examining and discussing what we see and think: 1. What is happening in this picture? 2. What do you SEE that makes you say that? 3. What else can you find?

Supplies

Please come to class each day with a pencil and eraser. At times, you will be working with wet and/or messy materials. Keep an old shirt or apron in your locker for those days. Advanced notice will be given of painting days.
